COVID-19 UPDATES & DISCUSSION: The Board had no updates to report.

ENGINEER: Award Contract – Moved by Wedemeyer and seconded by Hoadley to award the contract for FM-C001(114)—55-01 Farm to Market granular surfacing to Schildberg Construction Company for \$465,074.03. Approved. **Maintenance & Activities Report** – Kauffman gave an update to the Board on the following projects: Secondary Roads will be receiving \$263,015 for the Road Use tax COVID funding and \$73,506 for the Farm to Market COVID funding, Cunningham Reis working on N11 Jefferson bridge project, Jensen Construction not currently on site, Coron working on Jackson bridge, the Union County Shared Engineer Agreement, another position open due to Kyle Tanner's resignation, and trying to get information regarding the substation being used in Audubon County's wind turbine project. Janelle Schneider entered at 9:13 a.m. Kauffman exited at 9:16 a.m.

RECORDER: Janelle Schneider, County Recorder, informed the Board about her support of a bill being discussed about the Iowa Land Records System which allows documents to be filed electronically. HSB96 makes a technical correction concerning the 28E agreement that removes direct references to the lowa County Recorder's Association and established the existing ESS Coordination Committee as the primary governing board. This will eliminate the need for two different tax returns that were being done before. Schneider exited at 9:20 a.m. Brenda Wallace entered at 9:20 a.m.

PUBLIC HEARING: Moved by Wedemeyer and seconded by Hoadley to open the public hearing for the FY21 budget amendment at 9:20 a.m. Approved. No comments were received by the Auditor's Office, Supervisors, or public. Move by Twombly and seconded by Walker to close the public hearing at 9:22 a.m. Approved. Moved by Walker and seconded by Wedemever to approve Resolution #2021-17 – Approval of FY21 Budget Amendment. Be it resolved by the Adair County Board of Supervisors, that the amended budget for fiscal year 2021 be approved as published in the official newspapers of the County on February 10, 2021. Roll Call Vote: Shelley, aye; Hoadley, aye; Twombly, aye; Walker, aye; and Wedemeyer, aye. Approved. Moved by Hoadley and seconded by Wedemeyer to approve Resolution #2021-18 - Appropriations. FY2021 Appropriations increases as per budget amendment 02/24/2021. Roll Call Vote: Shelley, aye; Hoadley, aye; Twombly, aye; Walker, aye; and Wedemeyer, aye. Approved. Sign Budget Amendment - Moved by Walker and seconded by Hoadley for the Chair to sign the Budget Amendment. Approved.

PUBLIC HEARING: Moved by Walker and seconded by Hoadley to open the public hearing for the Proposed Maximum Property Tax dollars at 9:30 a.m. Approved. No comments were received by the Auditor's Office or Supervisors. Greg Cooper joined the conference call at 9:31 a.m. Cooper asked for clarification of the publication and wondered if the turbines would be lowering taxes. Auditor Berg explained that the publication showed an increase of 3.84% in tax dollars from FY21 in the General Services Funds and an increase of 4.24% increase in tax dollars being received in the Rural Services Fund. This increase is due to an increase in taxable valuations as the levies for these funds will remain the same as FY21. Supervisor Wedemeyer stated that wind turbines have allowed the Supervisors to hold down the levies and maintain the current levies. The majority of the money being received by the turbines are being used to complete projects that would normally need to be paid out of residents' taxes and therefore allow the levies to remain steady instead of increasing. Cooper and the Board discussed how turbines and the land surrounding the turbines are taxed. Pam Jensen, Assessor entered the call at 9:37 a.m. Cooper exited the call at 9:42 a.m. Moved by Wedemever and seconded by Twombly to close the public hearing at 9:42 a.m. Approved. Moved by Wedemeyer and seconded by Walker to approve Resolution #2021-19 -Approval of FY22 Maximum Property Tax Dollars Whereas, the Adair County Board of Supervisors have considered the proposed FY22 county maximum property tax dollars for both General County Services and Rural County Services, and Whereas, a notice concerning the proposed county maximum property tax dollars was published as required and posted on county web site and/or social media accounts if applicable, Whereas, a public hearing concerning the proposed county maximum property tax dollars was held on February 24, 2021, Now Therefore Be It Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Adair County that the maximum property tax dollars for General County Services and Rural County Services for FY22 shall not exceed the following: General County Services: \$3,077,728; Rural County Services: \$1,849,833. The FY22 Maximum Property Tax dollars requested in the General County Services increased by 3.84% whereas the Rural County Services increased by 4.24% from the Maximum Property Tax dollars requested for FY21. Roll Call Vote: Shelley, aye; Hoadley, aye; Twombly, aye; Walker, aye; and Wedemeyer, aye. Approved. Set Public Hearing - Moved by Shelley and seconded by Wedemeyer to set the public hearing for the FY22 Budget for March 17, 2021 at 9:15 a.m. Approved. Wallace exited at 9:46 a.m.

ACCESS SYSTEMS: Eddie Baijric, Access Systems entered the conference call at 9:49 a.m. Baijric made a presentation to the Board about updating the courthouse phone system to a cloud-based system as the courthouse's current Avaya phones would soon no longer be supported and the new Avaya phone system would not communicate with the old phones. The system has already been installed at the Engineer's office. Baijric presented a guote for a 36-month renewal lease program which would cost \$720.77/month and would include all the phone and hardware, call and support services, and installation. This would be an increase of \$120 compared to what the County is currently paying for phone service and support. The Board discussed the options and would like to know the cost if the County would buy the phones up front. Moved by Hoadley and seconded by Walker to table the discussion until they receive the additional quote for upfront phone costs and until the other departments can discuss and gather more information regarding the system. Approved.
