LIQUOR LICENSE RENEWAL: Moved by Twombly and seconded by Shelley to approve the liquor license renewal for Carol Ann Root at the 4H Building effective June 1, 2022. Approved.

CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION GRANT DRAW DOWNS: Moved by Shelley and seconded by Hoadley for Auditor Berg, as contract administrator, to sign the Child Abuse Prevention Grant Draw Downs for January and February. Approved.

CITY OF ORIENT RESOLUTION - STOPLIGHT ON FARM TO MARKET ROAD: The City of Orient has installed a stoplight and stop signs at the corner of Broad Street and 1st Street. Broad Street is a Farm to Market Road and therefore needs the consent of the County Board of Supervisors. Engineer Nick Kauffman and Sheriff Jeff Vandewater have been and a part of Orient's discussion and Kauffman would recommend that the Board signs the City's resolution as consent. Moved by Shelley and seconded by Hoadley to sign the City of Orient's Resolution acting as consent for the stoplights and stop signs to remain on Broad Street. Roll Call Vote: Wedemeyer, aye; Twombly, aye; Shelley, aye; Hoadley, aye; and Walker, aye. Approved.

AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT FUNDS - NEIGHBORHOOD CENTER: Supervisor Hoadley stated that MATURA would agree to update the Neighborhood Center's restroom to make it ADA compliant, flooring, and heating and cooling system if there was a 50% match from the County. Hoadley presented the three bids that had been received so far for the three projects with a total cost of \$32,200 and MATURA will work on getting other bids for the projects. Hoadley thought the County's half could be paid for using the American Rescue Plan Act Funds. Supervisor Shelley and Supervisor Twombly agreed the projects needed to be done and that the Neighborhood Center needs to continue to stay open, but they were not in favor of investing County money in a building that is owned by MATURA. Twombly stated after the updates were done, MATURA has the right to close the Neighborhood Center and sell the building. Twombly suggested that an agreement be put in place stating that the money would be paid back to the County if the building is sold or Neighborhood Center is closed. Hoadley stated that the County has never paid rent for the space and thinks the cost of these projects would be a minimal investment to make sure the Neighborhood Center remains open. Supervisor Wedemeyer stated that currently there is not a lot coming out of the County and taxpayers' pockets for the service we are receiving and thought maybe a five-year agreement with MATURA may be a good idea. The Board would like Hoadley to ask MATURA about an agreement and wait for other bids to come in before making a decision.
