TOWNSHIP CLERK WAGES: Moved by Hoadley and seconded by Walker to approve the Eureka Township Clerk, Jeanette Jorgensen, wages for \$20.00 and Richland Township Clerk, Evelyn Hopf, for \$20.00. Approved.

MIDDLE RIVER REPORT: Supervisor Twombly attended a meeting in Winterset regarding the Middle River. Twombly discussed the information he had received at the meeting and stated if they established a Middle River Board, they could apply for grant money for farm ground crops and to stop soil erosion. This group is planning on meeting again in November and will hopefully establish a Board. Joanie Finck joined via conference call at 9:09 a.m.

PIPELINE/EMINENT DOMAIN: Supervisor Wedemeyer had drafted a letter to the lowa Utilities Board regarding the Navigator Pipeline. The letter states the Board's concerns of the pipeline passing through Adair County and although they may not object to the construction or purpose of the pipeline, they do object to the use of eminent domain and taking away owner property rights. Moved by Shelley and seconded by Twombly to approve sending the letter to the lowa Utilities Board. Roll Call Vote: Wedemeyer, aye; Twombly, aye; Shelley, aye; Hoadley, aye; and Walker, aye. Approved. The supervisors discussed gathering information to put together an ordinance against eminent domain.

RENODRY USA: Michael Clancy entered at 9:13 a.m. Clancy presented the inspection and estimate report to the Board. The project estimate came up to \$15,370 which would include installation of two small units on the main courthouse level. Renodry would then return one and three years after installation to take comparative samples which is included in this cost. The Supervisors questioned Clancy on how the device works and about why the company had switched names. Moved by Hoadley and seconded by Shelley to get references from Renodry and to talk with Custodian Rich Wallace before making a decision. Approved. Clancy will send over their references. Nathan Jensen entered at 9:20 a.m. Duane Avey and John Schildberg III entered at 9:36 a.m. Clancy exited at 9:36 a.m.

WEED COMMISSIONER: Nathan Jensen, Weed Commissioner, stated that he had applied for the Living Roadway Trust Fund Grant for funding for the Kubota side by side. This will be a reimbursement to the County and was already budgeted for. The Board will need to pass a resolution and sign the grant application. They will be put on the agenda next week. Jensen exited at 9:40 a.m.

VETERANS' AFFAIRS – BUILDING LEASE: Duane Avey, VA Director and John Schildberg III, VA Commissioner, presented an updated lease with Nancy Young. The rent will remain the same at \$450.00/month, but the County will now be responsible for paying the electric bill. Young will continue to pay for the water, sewer, and gas. This would be a one-year lease. Supervisor Wedemeyer stated he didn't see any mention of who was responsible for paying the natural gas in the lease and believes it needs to be added before they approve it. Moved by Shelley and seconded by Twombly to table signing the lease until it can be updated to reflect the landlord paying for the natural gas. Approved. Avey also mentioned that they would be hosting a workshop for veterans ranging from Pottawattamie County to Polk County on September 29th at the fairgrounds with lunch included.
