**MEMORIAL HOSPITAL AUDITS:** Moved by Hoadley and seconded by Walker to acknowledge receipt of the FY21 and FY22 Adair County Memorial Hospital Auditors. Caleb Nelson – Adair County Free Press joined via conference call at 9:13 a.m. Nick Kauffman entered at 9:16 a.m.

**COURTYARD USE PERMIT:** Moved by Twombly and seconded by Hoadley approved the Courtyard Use Permit for Greenfield Main Street for the holiday decorations on the courtyard. Approved.

VETERANS' AFFAIRS: Will meet with the Board at a future date.

**ENGINEER: SW Townline Road Improvements** – Kauffman and the Board discussed the SW Townline Road improvements. The total of the project for the County's share is estimated around \$36,500 plus another \$8,000 for right of way. Greenfield City will be meeting next week to discuss the project and a 28E Agreement will be needed. Kauffman recommends to not approve the project until the 28E Agreement is ready. Moved by Twombly and seconded by Hoadley to table the discussion until the 28E Agreement is drafted. Approved. **N33 Orient Bridge Project** – Kauffman explained that this was the bridge that was recently damaged and is estimating the cost will be \$123,750 to return it to it's previous condition, which would be about half of the cost of putting in a new bridge. Moved by Twombly and seconded by Shelley to allow Kauffman to replace the N33 Bridge and add it to the current budget plan. Approved. **W31 Harrison Bridge Repair** – Kauffman state that the W31 Harrison Bridge is located on a dirt road and the surrounding roads and bridges are not in very good condition. Currently the bridge is barely sitting on piling and the caps need to be reset with it estimating to \$38,000. Kauffman believes that the best thing to do would be to fix the bridge allowing access in and out and to not raise the rating. Moved by Shelley and seconded by Walker to allow Kauffman to process with fixing the bridge using LOST funds. Approved. **Maintenance & Activities Report** – Engineer Kauffman gave an update to the Board on the following projects: Engineers association has put together a committee to go after federal funding and he will be submitting our 29 applications by tomorrow, culvert extension south of town, Washington bridge letting, N5 Richland, trucks have been put on Purple Wave for auction, stockpiling, fuel 28E Agreements are being reviewed by the County Attorney, 28E Agreement with Bridgewater, truck box replacement, and the DOT didn't like Kauffman's request for updating signs.
