Board members present for regular session at 9:00 a.m. were: Hoadley, Shelley, Twombly, Walker and Wedemeyer. Also present: Mandy Berg, Nick Kauffman, Nathan Baier, Jeff Vandewater, and Caleb Nelson. Ric Hansen - KJAN, Jennifer Nichols – Atlantic News Telegraph, Mandy Billings – KSOM joined via conference call.

All motions were approved unanimously unless noted otherwise.

Due to heightened public health risk from the coronavirus outbreak, the Board Meeting was held via conference call pursuant to Iowa Code section 21.8 along with in-person public attendance in the boardroom.

SUPERVISOR RECOGNITION: Chair Wedemeyer presented Supervisor Shelley with a certificate of appreciation for his 16 years of service to the County. Wedemeyer thanked Shelley for his dedication and numerous contributions to the County.

HISTORICAL SOCIETY: John Scarlett, Historical Society, entered at 9:10 a.m. Scarlett informed the Board that he had received the final bills for the Geothermal System for the Historical Society which comes up to \$12,272.65 in excess of the original amount given of \$45,000. The Museum does have some funds that can be put towards this additional cost, but any help they can get is appreciated as they are trying to conserve those funds for future costs. Supervisor Shelly stated that they should receive some difference in heating and cooling costs with this new system, so that can help with the Museums normal expenses and thought that splitting this amount equally between the County and Historical Museum would be fair. Supervisor Hoadley stated that she hoped the Board wouldn't have any issues with any of the other organizations that have asked for ARPA money and have been told no. Moved by Twombly and seconded by Shelley to put an additional \$6,800 of ARPA funds towards the Historical Society's Geothermal Project. Roll Call Vote: Wedemeyer, aye; Twombly, aye; Shelley, aye; Hoadley, aye; and Walker, aye. Approved. Scarlett thanked the Supervisors for their additional support. Supervisor Twombly exited at 9:18 a.m.

Moved by Shelley and seconded by Twombly to approve the Fontanelle Special Election Post-Election Audit and for the Auditor to file with the State.

HOMESTEAD & MILITARY DISALLOWANCES: Moved by Hoadley and seconded by Walker to acknowledge receipt of the 23 homestead and 8 military disallowances and for the chair to send the disallowance letters. Approved.

CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION GRANT DRAW DOWN: Moved by Shelley and seconded by Twombly for Auditor Berg, as contract administrator, to sign the Child Abuse Prevention Grant Draw Down. Approved.

EMPLOYEE PAY IN EVENT OF CLOSURE: The Board discussed how pay should be handled for employees when a county office closes due to inclement weather/emergencies as it is not effectively spelled out within the County Handbook. In the past, employees have always been paid for a regular workday when a closure is called by the Board. In last week's closure due to inclement weather, there were still some secondary roads workers called into work as well as dispatchers. Moved by Shelley and seconded by Hoadley for employees to be paid for their normal hours for the day of the closure and for those secondary roads employees and dispatchers who worked during the closure to be paid overtime (time and a half) for the hours worked in addition to their normal pay for that day. Approved. It was discussed to also have this updated in the handbook, so it is clearly stated going forward.
