**UTILITY AND POSTAGE CLAIMS RESOLUTION:** Moved by Twombly and seconded by Shelley to approve **Resolution #2018-28** – Payment Of Utilities And Postage Claims. Whereas, Chapter 331.506, Code of Iowa, allows the payment of postage and utility claims without prior board approval; Therefore, be it resolved by the Adair County Board of Supervisors, that the Adair County Auditor is authorized to prepare warrants for postage and utility claims for county departments, without prior board approval for FY19. Roll call vote: Hoadley, aye; Wedemeyer, aye; Homan, aye; Shelley, aye; and Twombly, aye. Approved.

**FY19 APPROPRIATIONS RESOLUTION:** Moved by Shelley and seconded by Hoadley to approve **Resolution #2018-29** – Appropriations. Whereas, it is desired to make appropriations for each of the different officers and departments for FY2019, in accordance with Section 331.434, subsection 6, Code of Iowa, Now Therefore, be it resolved by the Adair County Board of Supervisors as follows:

Section 1. The amounts itemized by department or office on the attached schedule are hereby appropriated to the department or office listed.

Section 2. Subject to the provisions of other county procedures and regulations, and applicable state law, the appropriations authorized under Section 1 shall constitute authorization for the department or officer listed to make expenditures or incur obligations from the fund, effective July 1, 2018.

Section 3. In accordance with Section 331.437, Code of Iowa, no department or officer shall expend or contract to expend any money or incur any liability or enter into any contract which by its terms involves the expenditure of money for any purpose in excess of the amounts appropriated pursuant to the resolution.

Section 4. If at any time during the FY19 budget year the Auditor shall ascertain that the available resources of a fund for that year will be less than said fund's total appropriations, she shall immediately so inform the Board of Supervisors and recommend appropriate corrective action.

Section 5. The Auditor shall establish separate accounts for the appropriations authorized in Section 1, each of which account shall indicate the amount of the appropriation, the amounts charged thereto and unencumbered balance. The Auditor shall report the status of each account to the applicable department and officer at least quarterly during the fiscal year.

Section 6. All appropriations authorized pursuant to this resolution lapse at the close of business on June 30, 2019.

**CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION GRANT:** Moved by Homan and seconded by Wedemeyer to approve Auditor Schaefer, as Contract Administrator, to sign the draw down for the Child Abuse Prevention Grant. Approved.

**MANURE MANAGEMENT PLAN UPDATES:** Moved by Twombly and seconded by Wedemeyer to acknowledge receipt of the Manure Management Plan updates from Rectenbaugh Site #1 and Rectenbaugh Site #2 both located at 3130 Lewis Avenue, Orient, Adair County. Approved.

**ADAIR COUNTY EMPLOYEE HANDBOOK:** Auditor Schaefer presented an update to the Adair County Employee Handbook about FMLA. Ahlers and Cooney informed Auditor Schaefer that the law that authorized the required use of any accrued comp time for FMLA leave has changed and the employee can no longer be required to use comp time during FMLA but may still use it if the employee elects. Also, the update adds language to clarify that sick leave is required to be used for FMLA. Moved by Wedemeyer and seconded by Shelley to approve the update to the Adair County Employee Handbook. Approved.

**LETTER OF SUPPORT – USDA GRANT:** Tiffany Johnson, Foundation Director entered at 9:15 a.m. Johnson asked the Board of Supervisors to write a letter of support for the Adair County Health System to show support for Essential Community Projects financed by USDA Rural Development in Iowa Grant. Moved by Shelley and seconded by Homan for the Chair to sign a letter of support. Approved.

**WIND FARM DISCUSSION:** Mike Lamb and Tammy Baier entered at 9:00 a.m. Additional citizens present: Linda Van Vleet, Colleen Oxley, Jerry Oxley, Chris Nikolaisen, Wayne Oxley, Connie Hansen, Lori Nelson, Mike Nelson, Eric Jeanneret, Joanie Finck, Skyler Rawlings, Marla Finck, Dale Lilly, Steven Lilly, Matt Kuhns, Bill Lamb, Lynn Schwartz, and Tim Foster. Mike Lamb spoke to the group. Lamb is concerned about the quality of life in the south part of Adair County. Lamb is asking the Board to consider implementing some restrictions to the wind turbines. He is asking the Board to implement some protection to the citizens of Adair County. Lamb explained that he understands that the money is helping the County. Baier explained that she loves the farm life and everything that comes with living in the County. She does not want to live in the middle of an electrical grid. She does not want to hear the sound of the turbines or see the blinking lights of the turbines. As an employee for SIRWA, Baier is concerned about making sure the locate is done accurately for the safety of other crews that work in the right-of-ways. Baier discussed her concerns with the quality of life with the amount of hertz that come off of the turbines and the health concerns that can be caused by the turbines and discussed a study that was done on sleep apnea with the sound that comes from the turbines. Baier talked about the future generations that the turbines will effect and what happens if the turbines are abandoned. Twombly stated that the supervisors will review the current ordinance and look into other options but cannot say where that will lead yet. Wedemeyer stated that he is unsure if something is passed that it will change the rules for the turbines that already have contracts. Hoadley stated that she understands that the group would like the supervisors to consider implementing mandatory setbacks for turbines. Bill Lamb stated that he was on the Board when the ordinance was implemented but he did not have any idea the implications that it would bring and what currently is happening. Tim Foster stated that the Supervisors are in office to help keep the public and

citizens of Adair County safe. Foster is asking the Supervisors to look into what the County can do about the setbacks. Mike Nelson state that he is also concerned about the setbacks from dwelling. Skylar Rawlings stated that he has five coming near his home. Connie Hansen stated that she was asked to sign a neighborhood agreement but did not. She feels her neighbors are taking her rights away and they are being harassed to sign the neighborhood agreement. Hansen is worried about the health concerns and is asking the supervisors to look into it further. Marla Finck asked what the supervisors are going to do if the next farm is suggested. Wedemeyer stated that this is something the Board has started to talk about. Lori Nelson stated that it came on so fast with no communication and Foster expanded on that and the setbacks. Shelley stated that we cannot do anything about contracts that have already been signed with private land owners. Hoadley thanked everyone for coming to the Board Meeting to voice their concerns. Group exited at 10:11 a.m.

Moved by Twombly and seconded by Shelley for the Chair to sign the Real Estate Contract. Approved.

**ENGINEER:** Nick Kauffman, County Engineer entered at 9:32 a.m. **Pickup Bids –** Kauffman presented a quote from Bob Brown for a 2018 pickup. The 2019s are not available until next year due to being on back order. The state bid is \$34,695 for a 2018 Chevy Silverado 1500 4WD. Moved by Shelley and seconded Homan by to accept the bid from Bob Brown for \$34,695. Approved. **Report of Maintenance and Activities –** Kauffman gave an update to the Board on the following projects: DOT Detour rock request, yearend budget and fund balance, N72 North of Fontanelle, W23 Prussia, N23 Prussia, Orient Wind Farm, Arbor Hill Project, Closed Roads due to down powerlines, and the crews are working on stop signs that were damaged in yesterday's storm. Kauffman exited at 10:30 a.m.

**COURTHOUSE TREE:** Moved by Twombly and seconded by Shelley to have SLS Tree Service remove the tree that was severely damaged in yesterday's storm. Approved.

**BOARD/COMMITTEE REPORTS:** Supervisor Wedemeyer gave an update on Midwest Partnership and exited at 10:28 a.m. Supervisor Twombly had nothing to update; Supervisor Shelley gave an update on E911; Supervisor Hoadley gave an update on Crossroads; and Supervisor Homan did not have any June meetings.
