

Your Property Tax Dollar




Urban Taxpayers





Adair County collected \$12,634,365 in Fiscal Year 2016. One-third of the revenue came from Property Taxes, one-third from Road Use Tax and TIF Tax, and One-third from other Miscellaneous Sources. Road Use Tax, TIF Tax, Bridge Replacement, LOSST Tax, and Time-21 account for about 50% of the County's revenue. This 50% is all used for Secondary Roads purposes.






Expenditures

Adair County expenditures were \$14,106,424 in Fiscal Year 2016. Nearly \$8 Million (57%) of the County's expenditures were for Secondary Roads purposes. Due to spending down bond proceeds, the expenditures in Fiscal Year 2016 were more that the revenues.

Secondary Roads

Adair County Secondary Roads is a major part of Adair County's Organization and Operations. In FY2016, the Secondary Roads Fund expended nearly \$8 million with the majority (74%) of the expense was on maintenance and construction of roads and bridges. The revenue that went directly into the Secondary Roads fund was nearly \$5.9 million with the majority (52%) from Road Use Tax. Although Adair County transfers the maximum allowable under the law, Property Taxes make up only 21% of the Secondary Roads revenue for FY2016.



This is the approximate cost for Adair County crews to spread rock at a rate of 500 tons/mile including trucking, labor, and materials for a location approximately 15 miles from the quarry.

Motorgrader Districts

Rock Roads only Summer Months 10 districts = 79.30 miles/grader Winter Months 11 districts = 72.09 miles/grader

In the Winter, a motorgrader traveling 5mph continuously, would take 14.42 hours to clear a district
